ACT STUDY TIPS: THE ACT IS COMING UP SOON!

All juniors will be required to take the ACT on December 11, before Christmas break, so here are some study tips for juniors and anyone else who chooses to take the test this year.

Tip #1: If you haven't started studying yet, start as soon as possible.

Tip #2: Know what you'll be tested on. You can practice tests from previous years, and read summaries of the general types of questions that will be on the test on act.org to get a better idea of what they're testing you for.

Tip #3: Don't just use practice tests for practice questions, also use them to familiarize yourself with the way directions and questions will be worded.

Tip #4: The test will be timed, so to get the most questions right, skip questions that are taking you too long, you can always go back to them later. And, although you shouldn't let these questions take up too much time, it's still better to guess than to leave them blank.

Tip #5: Use process of elimination.

Tip #6: Read the questions before reading the passage.

Tip #7: Prepare the night before: Make sure to get enough sleep, eat some breakfast, and stay hydrated.

Tip #8: Remember that your test scores do not define you and you can retake the test later.

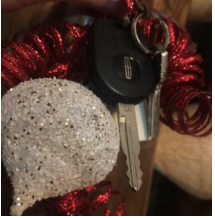

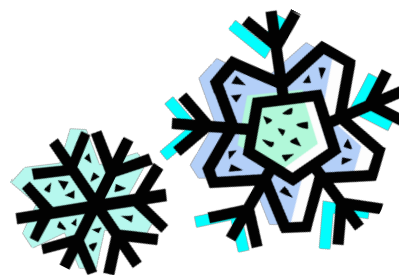
